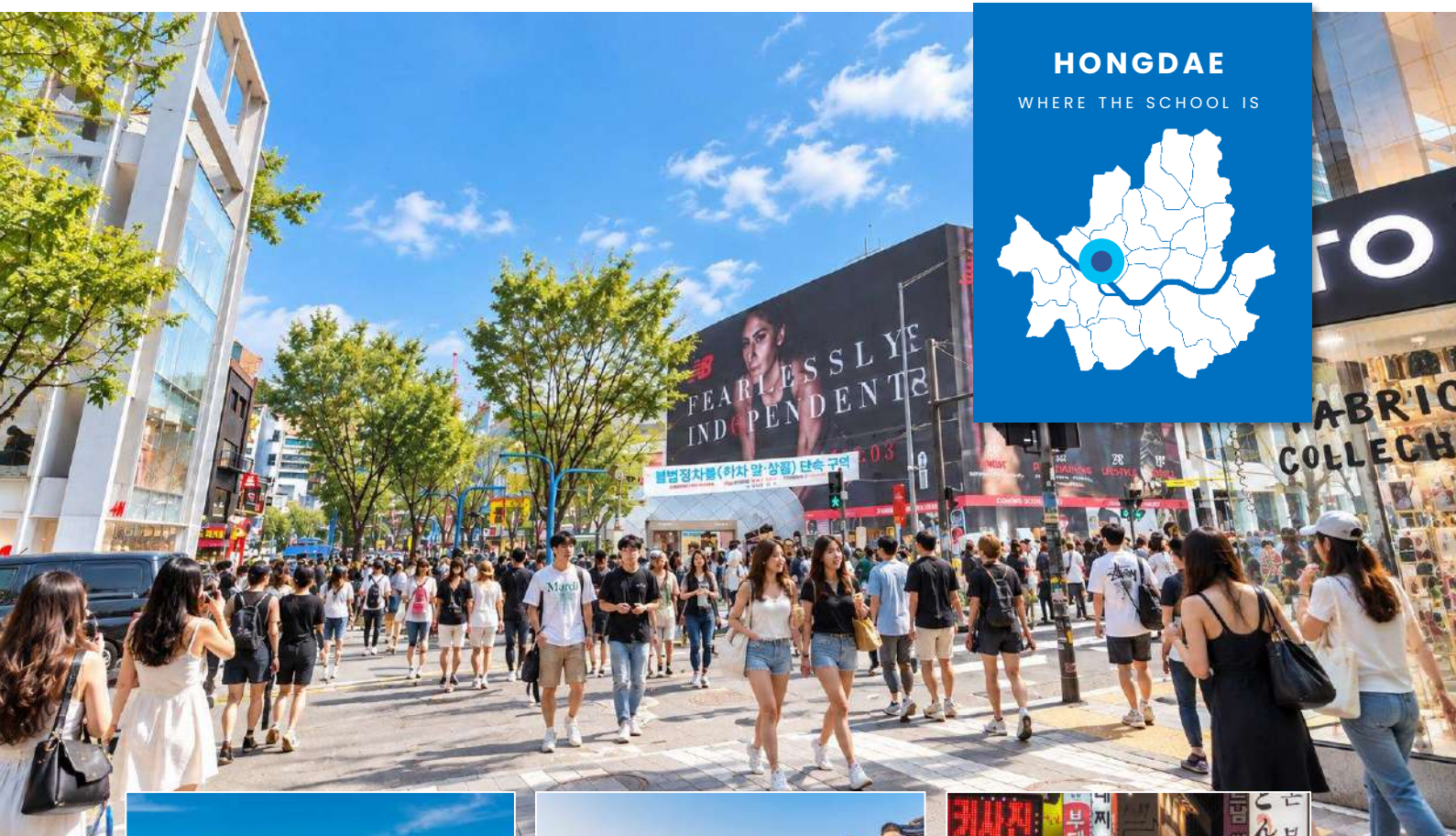
Seoul is a city of contrasts—fast-moving yet deeply rooted, where tradition, creativity, and everyday life come together at every turn.

Your arrival is carefully planned, from airport pickup to settling in and getting ready for your first day.

THE DAY YOU LAND

Arrive at Incheon or Gimpo Airport

After collecting your luggage and clearing customs, head to the arrivals hall, where our pickup team will be expecting you.

02

Meet the pickup team

A member of our pickup team is waiting inside the arrivals hall, holding a sign. From here on, you are not traveling alone.

03

Travel to your accommodation

From the airport, we travel together to your accommodation, making your first journey in Seoul simple and comfortable.

04

Accommodation check-in

We take you directly to your accommodation, so you can arrive comfortably, get settled at your own pace, and begin your stay in Seoul.

Incheon International (ICN) is about one hour from the school. Pickup and drop-off fees, booking deadline and meeting point to be confirmed.

Then, rest.

Your first day is deliberately kept free. Unpack, sleep off the flight, walk to the nearest convenience store — and be ready for your first day at school tomorrow.

The First Day At School

Your first day is about getting comfortable — with the school, your class and the people around you. By the end of the day, Seoul feels a little less unfamiliar and you already know a few faces.

Welcome ceremony

Everyone starting that week, in one room, introduced to each other.

02

Speaking Level test

A short written and spoken test. It decides the class you join, by level

03

New Student Orientation

How the school works: the timetable, the credit system, the building.

04

Welcome Pizza Party

You meet your teacher and your class, and the group eats together afterwards.

The Welcome Ceremony and Welcome Pizza Party are available on term start dates only.

Your first day is more than an introduction. It is a chance to meet your classmates, get to know the school, and begin your time at Rolling Korea together.

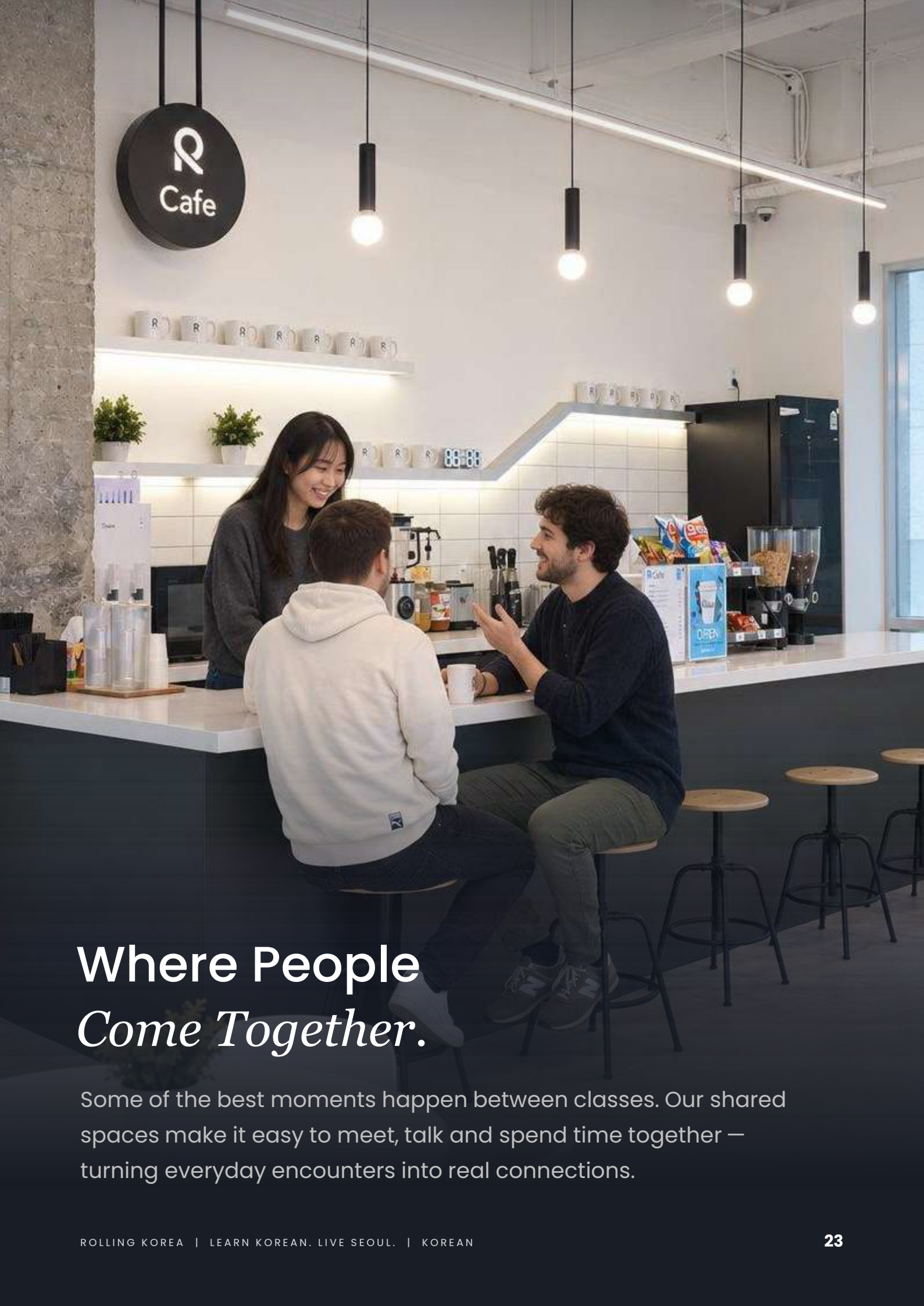

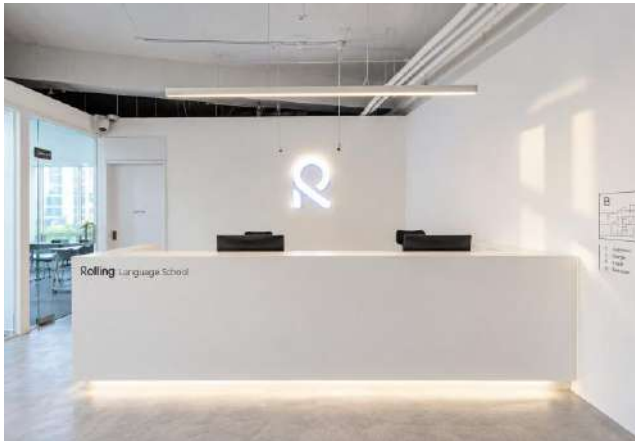

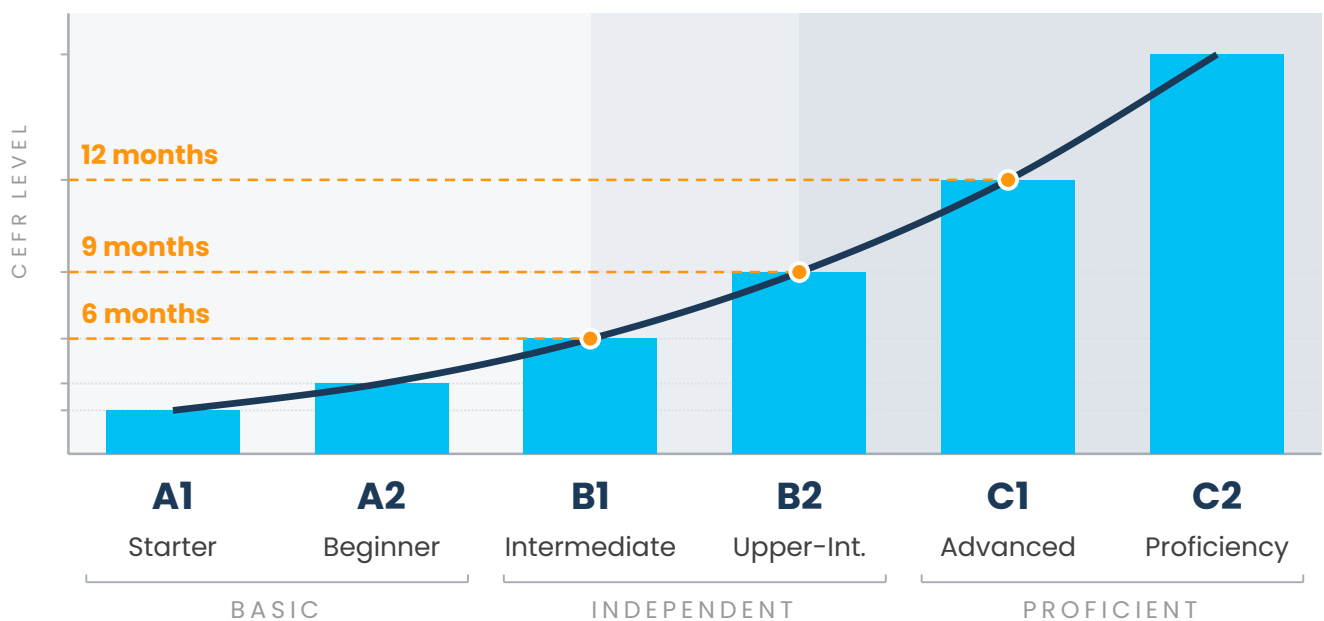
- **I want Korean, but also the whole city.** General or Semi-Intensive — mornings in class, afternoons in Seoul.
- **I want to improve as fast as possible.** Intensive — the most hours on the timetable, three S.F.L afternoons.
- **I need a score for university or a job.** TOPIK Preparation — built around the exam and the paperwork.
- **I came for the music.** Korean plus K-pop — Korean in the morning, dance and vocal after lunch.

Not sure? Your level test comes with a short chat — we will recommend one.

How your Korean grows.

On your first day, even a simple conversation may feel like a challenge. A few months later, you may find yourself ordering for the table, chatting with friends, and understanding more of the Korean happening around you. Progress comes step by step – and often, you notice it in everyday moments before you see it on a test.

AFTER CLASS, MORE TO TRY.

Afternoons are for trying something different — from K-POP dance and vocal classes to SFL and other special programs designed to make every day in Seoul a little different.

Where Will *Your Afternoon Take You?*

Morning classes bring everyone together. In the afternoon, students follow different paths — from Korean study to K-pop dance and vocals, depending on their course.

Take K-POP beyond the playlist.

The K-POP Course combines Korean language study with afternoon dance and vocal training — giving you the chance to experience K-POP through both movement and voice.



DANCE CLASS, WEDNESDAY AND FRIDAY AFTERNOONS

The class runs in a dance studio, not a classroom. A routine is taught section by section, counted out loud, and repeated until the room moves together.

Work with K-POP songs through vocal training, focusing on pronunciation, rhythm and expression as you learn to sing in Korean.



Vocal on Monday.

Practice K-POP songs while working on Korean pronunciation, rhythm and expression in a supportive vocal class.

Students on the K-POP Course sit the same morning Korean classes and the same tests, and share every social activity and weekend trip with the rest of the school.

Go further in the afternoon.

S.F.L. — Special Focus Lesson — is the afternoon Korean class. Less grammar, more speaking: students take what they learned in the morning and use it on real topics, sometimes out in the city.

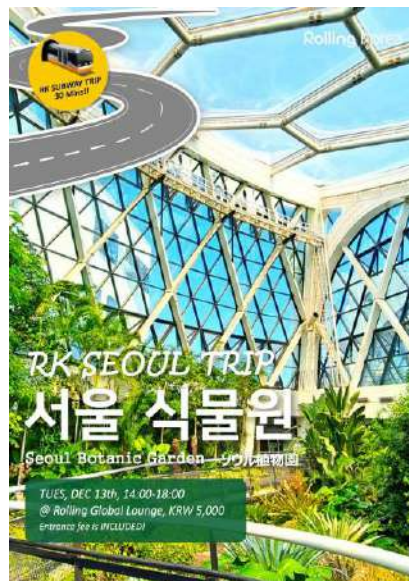

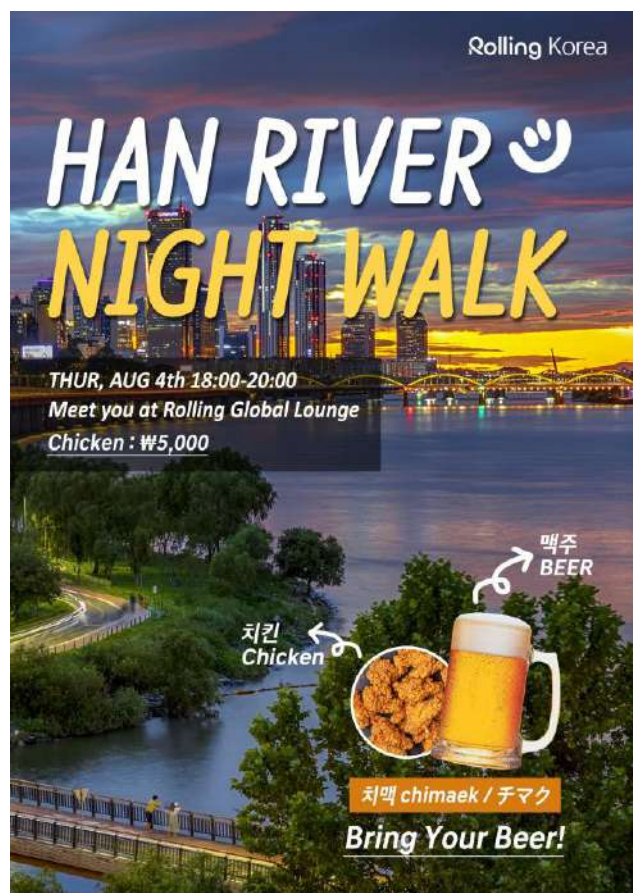

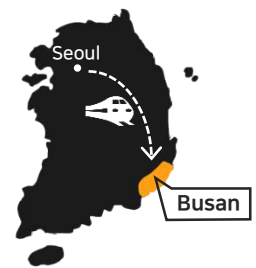

How meals work

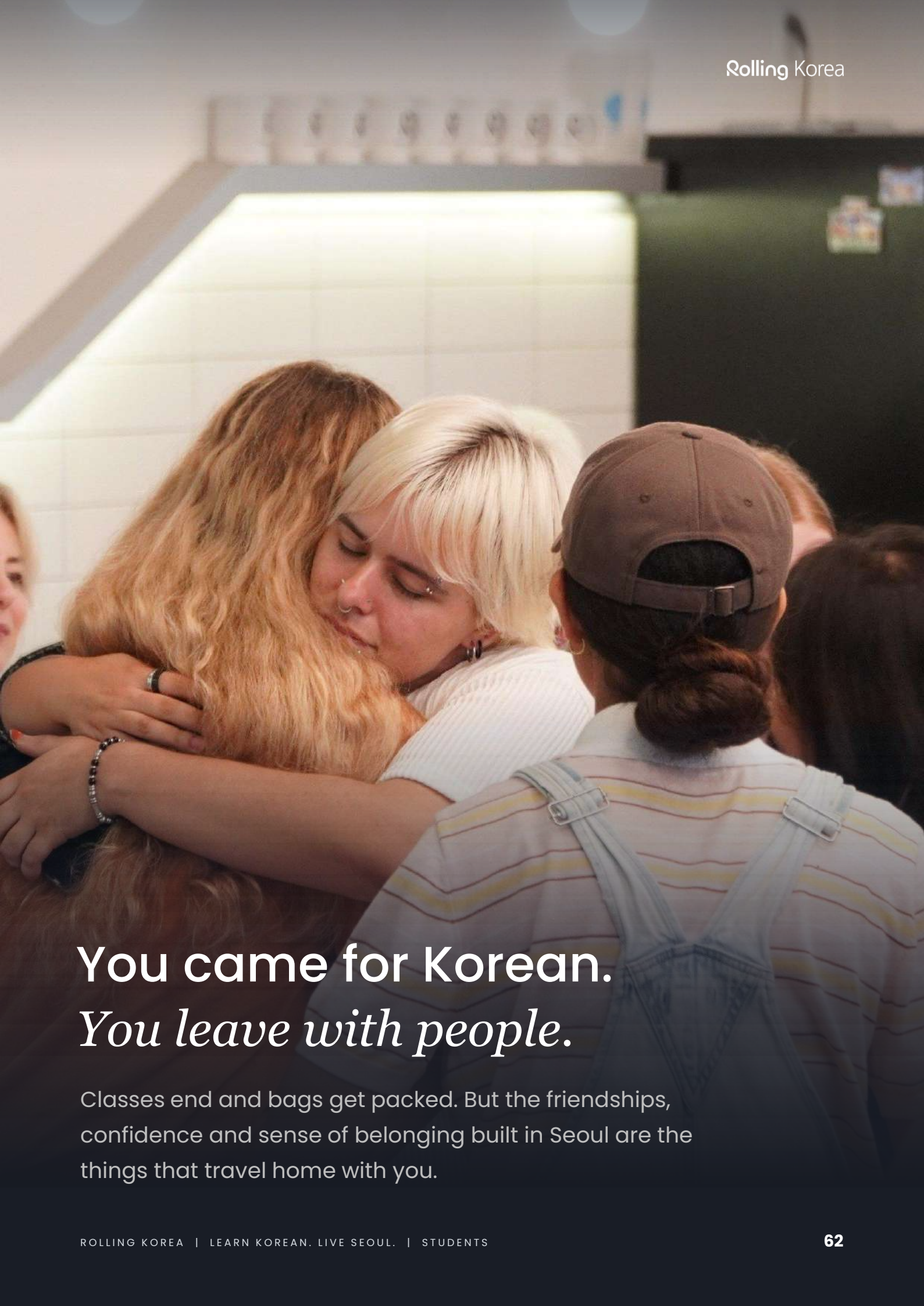

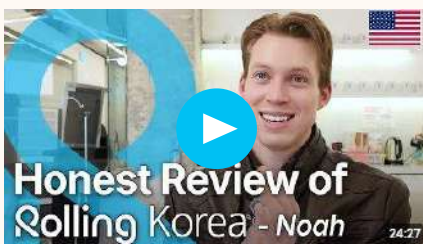
