Rolling Korea runs social activities throughout the month — city tours, food outings, cooking classes, K-pop experiences, class lunches, and welcome and completion ceremonies. They are the easiest way to practise your Korean and make friends outside the classroom.

KIC creates activities where people connect, experience Korea, and use Korean naturally.

Our activities are designed to bring people together, create natural opportunities to use Korean, and turn what you learn in class into real experiences.

Language grows through use, so we create opportunities for students to speak Korean naturally, connect with others, and experience more of life in Korea.

At the Korea Immersion Lab, we continue to develop each activity based on how students participate, communicate, and connect.

ON THE DAY

Everything is ready for the experience.

Every activity begins with a short orientation, so everyone knows where we're going, what to expect, and how the day will unfold.

Throughout the activity, the RK team stays with the group, taking care of the route, timing, and coordination so students can focus on enjoying the experience and connecting with each other.

By the end of the day, we hope every student takes away three things: new connections, a memorable experience, and more confidence using Korean.

Open to everyone at no cost. No credits are needed to join.

Each one has a set credit price, and you join using your credits.

Activities run all year round

We hold social activities two to three times every week, and three to four times a week during high season.

How your credits work

CREDITS / WEEK

Included in your registration

Every week of your course comes with 10 activity credits (₩10,000), charged at registration. Use them to join our paid activities.

HOW A CREDIT MOVES

1

STEP 1

Loaded

₩10,000 a week, added when you register.

2

STEP 2

Used

Deducted automatically for each activity you join.

3

STEP 3

Check

Ask the front desk for your balance at any time.

4

STEP 4

Settled

Any difference is cleared before you leave.

● Within your credits

Join any paid activity — the cost comes off your balance automatically. Nothing to pay on the day.

● Over your credits

Top up at the front desk and keep joining. The difference is settled before you leave.



Activity credits must be used during the course. Unused credits are NOT refunded, so please join as many as you can.

The credit prices shown are examples — they change each month with conditions on the ground. Every activity's price is printed on the monthly schedule.

- You can check your remaining credits at the front desk at any time.

Subway, bus, and your own card

Almost everything in this guide is reached the way everyone in Seoul reaches it: subway and bus. We meet at the lounge and travel as a group, but each person taps in with their own card.

NOT INCLUDED

Fares are yours to top up

Activity credits cover the activity itself. Subway and bus fares you load onto your own T-money card and spend as you go.

Buy one

Any convenience store sells them, over the counter.



2

Load it

Top-up machines sit inside every subway station.



3

Tap in, tap out

Works on the subway and on buses. Tapping out keeps transfers cheap.

If you arrive without one, ask at the front desk on your first day.

SCENE 01 · EVERY MONDAY · LUNCH

Monday Class Lunch

Your class, one table, straight after the last period.

Your first meal with new friends.

When Monday's last period ends, the class goes and eats together — you, the people you have been sitting beside all morning, and the teacher who has been correcting you for three hours. It is the smallest activity we run and the one almost everybody ends up at.

It is also where the Korean from class gets its first honest test: ordering, asking what something is, arguing about what to get. A surprising amount of the vocabulary you actually keep comes from a table like this one.

KOREA IMMERSION LAB · DIRECTOR'S NOTE

We could have left lunch alone and let people sort it out themselves. But the hour right after class is when the words are still fresh, and eating together is the least intimidating way to use them. So we put it on the schedule and we keep it there.

SCENE 02 · CULTURE · HALF DAY

Gyeongbokgung Palace Tour

Some places you visit. Gyeongbokgung, you step into.

Step into the heart of old Seoul — dressed for it.

We'll help you pick a hanbok you love, then walk together through Gyeongbokgung — the grandest of Korea's royal palaces, with the mountains rising behind it. Built in 1395, it was the main palace of the Joseon dynasty and the largest of the Five Grand Palaces.

Expect painted eaves, a lotus pond, and more photos than your phone is ready for. Nobody rushes here. No Korean required, no experience needed — come as you are and leave dressed like a royal.

We didn't design this one for the photographs, even though nobody leaves without them. Hanbok changes the way people move — they slow down, they look up, they start asking what things are. That question is what the day was built around.

HIKR Ground brings K-POP into an interactive space where you can experience the music, visuals, and energy for yourself. Explore K-POP-themed zones, step onto a dance stage, create your own videos, and discover some of the creative elements behind Korean pop culture.

It's less about watching and more about joining in. Dance with your friends, try the interactive content, take photos, and create your own K-POP moments together.

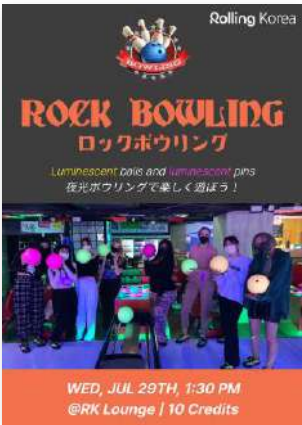
This one exists for week one. New students don't need another tour, they need a room where talking to a stranger is easy. Bad bowling does that faster than anything else we have tried.

Korean winter has its own kind of energy. We wanted an activity that lets students step into it, have fun together, and experience the season beyond the classroom.

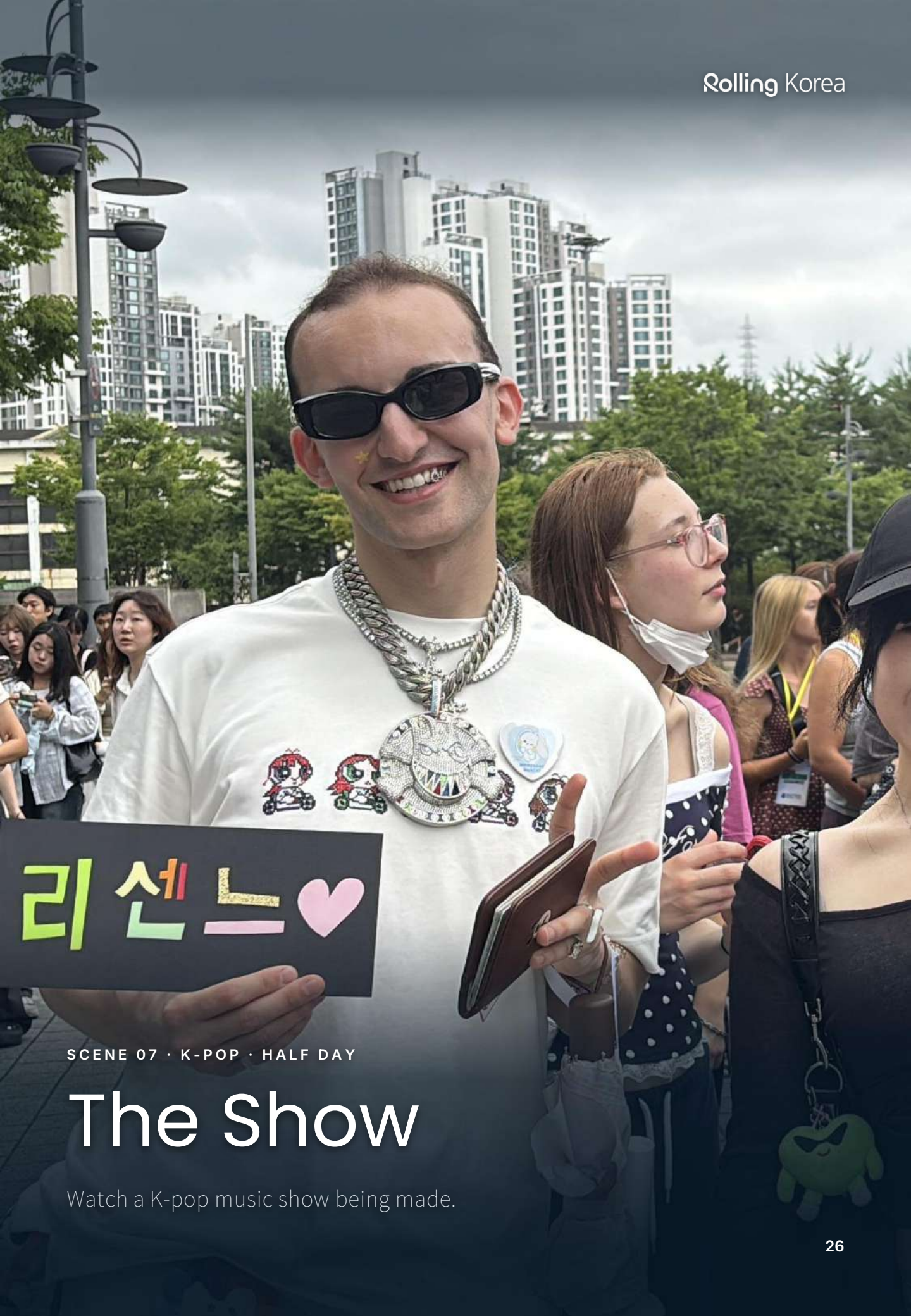

SCENE 08 · CULTURE · HALF DAY

Bongeunsa Temple

A thousand years of quiet, right behind Gangnam.

The oldest thing in the newest part of Seoul.

Bongeunsa sits in Gangnam with the COEX towers rising directly behind it. You step in off one of the busiest streets in Korea and the noise simply stops — wooden halls, incense, the Great Buddha standing over the hill, monks going about an ordinary day.

In spring the whole courtyard is roofed with paper lanterns for Buddha's Birthday, each one carrying somebody's name. We walk it together, slowly, and nobody is in a hurry. It may be the calmest hour you spend in this city.

Seoul is loud and our schedule is loud. I wanted one activity that asks nothing of anyone. Walk slowly, look at things, and go back into Gangnam ten minutes later feeling different.

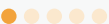

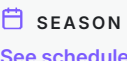
You learn people quickly on a trip. By the time the group comes home, students who barely spoke to each other in class have inside jokes nobody else understands.

Busan runs along the coast and wears it: beaches inside the city, a fish market the size of a neighbourhood, and painted houses stacked up the hills above the harbour.

It is far enough from Seoul that things sound a little different — the Korean included. Coming back, Seoul suddenly feels like a place you know.

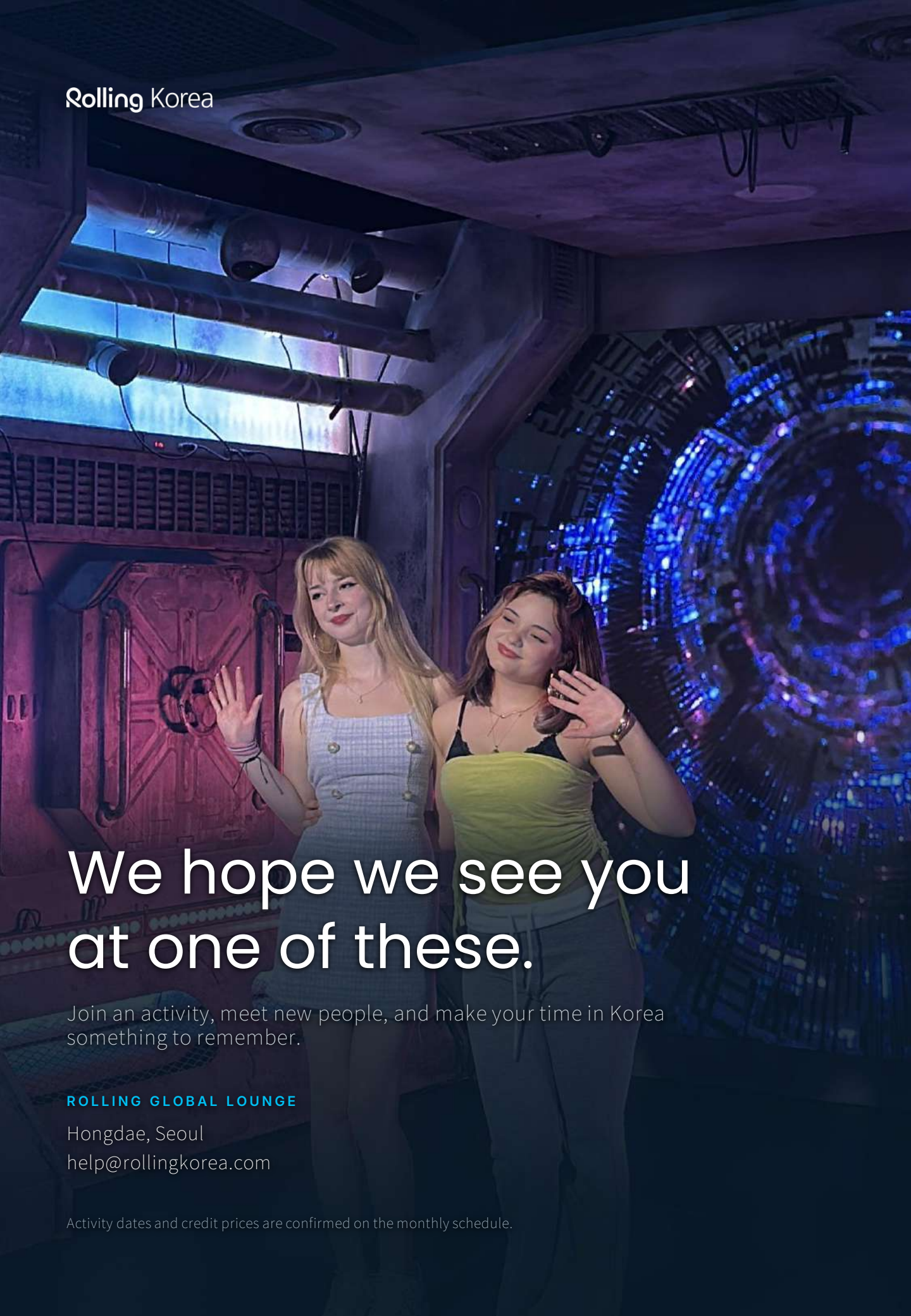
